4. **AUDIENCE**

### 4.1. BILL WANTLAND

BILL WANTLAND ADDRESSED THE BOARD REGARDING THE RESTAURANT THAT IS NEXT DOOR TO HIS MOTHERS HOUSE ON S H ST. STATES THEY ARE USING THE ALLEY BETWEEN THEIR HOUSE AND THE RESTAURANT FOR PARKING. MAYOR WEAR STATES THAT ACCORDING TO THE OLD PLAT RECORDS, THAT WAS NEVER AN ALLEY AND THE ORIGINAL OWNER USED THAT SIDE OF THE RESTAURANT FOR TRUCK DELIVERIES. MR. WANTLAND COMPLAINS THAT THEY ARE PARKING EVERYWHERE, INCLUDING THEIR YARD AND FRONT OF THE THEIR HOUSE ESPECIALLY ON THE WEEKENDS. TRUSTEE FINLEY ASKED IF THEY HAD EVER HAD THE PROPERTY SURVEYED AND MR. WANTLAND SAYS NO. MR. WANTLAND ALSO COMPLAINING ABOUT HEALTH VIOLATIONS AND HAS SPOKEN WITH THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT WHO TOLD HIM THE VILLAGE NEEDS TO SEND SOMEONE INSIDE TO SEE THE CODE VIOLATIONS, NOT ONLY ON THE INSIDE BUT THE OUTSIDE. MR WANTLAND ALSO COMPLAINING ABOUT WHERE THE DUMPSTER IS AS WELL. MAYOR WEAR STATES THERE IS ORDINANCE REGARDING ENCLOSING DUMPSTERS. TRUSTEE SIMS ASKED CHIEF BERNARDI IF THE ALLEY COULD BE PATROLLED AND CHIEF BERNARDI STATES THAT THE NORTH SOUTH ALLEY HAS NEVER HAD ANY ISSUES AND HAS NEVER RECEIVED ANY COMPLAINTS. TRUSTEE WEIDENBURNER AGAIN ASKED IF THEY HAVE

EVER FILED A COMPLAINT AND MR WANTLAND STATES NO, THAT IS WHY HE IS HERE TONIGHT, AND THEY ARE THE ONLY ONES AFFECTED BY THIS. TRUSTEE SIMS STATES HE NEEDS TO CALL 911 WHEN THE ALLEY IS BLOCKED SO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT CAN FOLLOW UP. CHIEF BERNARDI ADDED THAT THEY DO NEED TO BE VALID COMPLAINTS AND IF THEY SHOW UP AND NOTHING IS WRONG AND MR. WANTLAND CONTINUES TO CALL 911 THEN HE CAN BE CITED FOR MISUSE OF 911. PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR TJ GEORGE INFORMED MR WANTLAND THAT THE ROCK PUT BEHIND THE HOUSE IN THE ALLEY WAS DONE SO TO KEEP TRUCKS FROM CUTTING THE CORNER, NOT TO KEEP PEOPLE FROM PARKING IN THE AREA. ALSO STATED THAT THE ROADWAY, ALL UP AND DOWN S H ST, IN FRONT OF RESIDENCES IS PUBLIC PARKING AND NOT PRIVATE TO THE HOMEOWNER. TRUSTEE SHEETS STATES THAT THE PROPERTY NEEDS RESEARCHED AND SURVEYED TO DETERMINE WHERE THE PROPERTY LINES ARE, WHETHER THERE WAS AN ALLEY THERE BACK IN THE DAY, TRUSTEE WEIDENBURNER STATES HE AGREES AND THEN IF WE HAVE A COMPLAINT, CALL IT IT IN AND WE WILL DO WHAT NEEDS TO BE DONE. MR. WANTLAND SAYS HE IS NOT PAYING FOR A SURVEY, AND TRUSTEE WEIDENBURNER STATES THAT BETWEEN THE TWO OF YOU, YOU HAVE TO FIGURE OUT WHERE THE PROPERTY LINE IS, THEN WE CAN GO FROM THERE.

ENGINEER OVERMYER STATES FORGOT TO UPDATE ON THE CULVERS UTILITIES. FARNSWORTH GROUP HAS PUT TOGETHER SEPARATE PLANS FOR THE SANITARY EXTENSION, WATER MAIN RELOCATION AND STORM SEWER. STATES THE STORM SEWERS DOES NOT JUST BENEFIT CULVERS, THEY BENEFIT THE WHOLE AREA. STATES IS GOING TO ASK THEM TO PUT THEM TOGETHER, ONE SET OF PLANS AND BIDDING DOCUMENTS SO WE CAN DO THE PROJECT.
